1st International Meeting of Young Geologists organized by the Youth Committee of the Geological Society of Hungary, 22–28th August, 1991 Budapest, Hungary. Symposium on DIAPIRISM with special reference to IRAN, 8th-14th December, 1990, Teheran-Islamic Republic of Iran. Objective: Zagros Structural Zone, especially its southeastern part, is an attractive site of DIAPIRISM, represented by spectacular salt diapirs and related structures. These structures have long perplexed geologists who elaborated the mechanism of emplacement of such salt diapirs. Furthermore in southeast Iran, general diapiric phenomena have an important role on the structural petrological evolution of metamorphic and ophiolitic terrains which deserve intensive scientific investigations. Discussion and exchange of ideas on the DIAPIRISM in general and special attention to the role of diapiric phenomena in the geological evolution of Iranian territory is the main objective of the symposium.

The first three days of the symposium are devoted to the oral presentation of papers and for last three days field excursion to salt diapirs of Persian Gulf area and ophiolitic terrains are planned.
