International Conference on Environmental Impact of Coal Utilisation (Raw Material to Waste Resources). (Supported by International Development Research Centre, Canada and organised by IIT Bombay and University of Western Ontario, Canada) 14th, 15th and 16th January 1991.

Coal deposits are repository of a host of heavy metals. These get released on mining and burning of coal and add to the various ecocompartments.

High ash coal produces large amounts of residue including fly ash. Disposal of ash poses several problems for large thermal power plants. The ash may be enriched in toxic heavy metals. Leaching out of the metals is a distinct possibility.

Utilisation of the ash for various purposes is a challenging possibility and characterization of the material is a basic prerequisite.

Topics to be discussed are: 1. Occurrences of trace elements in coal. 2. Fate of trace elements during combustion of coal. 3. Characterization of fly ash, its properties and utilisation. 4. Environmental impact of ash disposal and utilisation.
