
PROFESSOR L. RAMA RAO CENTENARY CELEBRATIONS

The Birth Centenary of Professor L. Rama Rao (1896-1996) teacher, researcher and founder-editor of the Journal of the Geological Society of India was celebrated on the auspicious *Ramanavami* day of 28th March 1996 at the premises of the Geological Society of India at Bangalore.

In a simple yet elegant function, Professor S.B. Bhatia of Punjab University, Chandigarh, released the *Centenary Rama Rao Volume* (Memoir 37) devoted to the "Cretaceous Stratigraphy and Palaeoenvironments" (Edited by Prof. Ashok Sahni), a subject that was dear to Late Prof. L. Rama Rao.
