During those 17 years I had spent much time in field and French laboratories which were most fruitful and rewarding period in my career. I am extremely grateful to my French collaborators Prof. Jean-Jacques Peucat, Prof. Herve Martin,

Prof. Pierre Choukroune and Prof. Dominique Chardon whose invaluable support, encouragement and academic interactions have greatly strengthened my research career. In the late nineties I began to work with Japanese collaborators on the Archaean ultramafic magmatism and thermal history under JSPS funded international programs, which provided me further access to advanced analytical facilities. I am extremely grateful to Prof. Takashi Kano (Yamaguchi University) for stimulating discussions, great care, affection and constant support. I also wish to express my sincere gratitude to Dr. S.M. Naqvi, Dr. M. Ramakrishnan, late Prof. A.S. Janardhan, Sri. R.H Sawkar, Sri S.V. Srikantia, Dr. M.S. Rao and several senior colleagues from Universities and national laboratories for fruitful interactions and encouragement.

I am immensely thankful to all esteemed colleagues in the Department for their encouragement and support.
