NATIONAL SEMINAR ON CHANGING GEOHYDROLOGICAL SCENARIO AND ITS ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

The Geological Society of India with Tarun Bharat Sangh is organising the above seminar on 29-30th April 2009 at Jaipur / Bhikampura, Rajasthan.

Economic reforms launched in India, as part of the globalisation process, have unleashed a number of changes in natural resource use, particularly land, water and mineral resources in different parts of India. One of the steps of this reform is setting up SEZs in India and that has triggered a major change in the landuse in most states. Fast urbanization and nationwide development of infrastructure has further pushed the blind exploitation of natural resources, with significant environmental consequences.

The analysis of the nature of economic growth in India since independence shows that it has been mainly based on the exploitation of natural resources without much care to the conservation and health of the resources. It will be too late if we do not review our past actions from environmental perspective and take serious policy measures to correct the course of development.


Seminar Themes: The seminar will deliberate on the following themes based on case studies, field experience/experiments and success stories:
