

AN ACCOUNT OF THE FLOWERING PLANTS OF INDORE DISTRICT
IN MADHYA PRADESH *

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A B S T R A C T

This account of the flowering plants of Indore district is based on the observations made during 1961, 1962 and 1963. The enumeration includes 566 species 373 genera and 94 families of the flowering plants. The nomenclature has been revised to conform to modern taxonomic usage in accordance with the Montreal Code.

Indore, now a district of Madhya Pradesh comprises part of the Malwa plateau, lying approximately within Lat. $22^{\circ}22' N$ and Long. $75^{\circ}15' E$. It has natural boundaries in three directions, extending from a little way west of the Chambal river to Sipra river in the east. The southern boundary runs along the ridges of the Vindhya mountains between Karam river and Choral river. The northern boundary with Ujjain district is an artificial line. The Bombay-Agra Highway runs diagonally in the middle passing through Indore city, located almost in the centre of the district; other roads radiate in different directions from Indore city.

Much of the district is flat, plain country, with only the southern strip having elevated hills, forming part of the Vindhya mountains. The entire area is traversed by innumerable streams and a few rivers.

Geologically the area consists of crystalline rocks, mostly granite and with tongues of the Deccan Trap. The soil is gravelly, coarse and dry in the hills, and black clayey in the plains.

The climate varies to extremes, the temperature reaching $40^{\circ}C$ in summer, and falling to $5^{\circ}C$ in winter. The annual rainfall is about 100 cm with the hills receiving more rain than the plains.


Botanically this area has received little attention, although in a general way the botany of central India and adjacent regions has been known mainly due to the efforts of Forsyth, Brandis and a few others. For the then princely state of Indore, a very short note with an account of some of the common plants, has been provided in the Imperial Gazetteer (1908). For the same area Biscoe, a Conservator of Forests in that State, has published a list of woody plants (1910). However, this work professing to be a 'nearly complete' account of the trees and shrubs, was compiled in a hurry 'on the eve of his departure to England without access to any collections of specimens and almost wholly from personal observation in the field'. Accordingly the present account of the flowering plants of Indore district is based on three fairly long periods (14 to 22 December, 1961; 18 to 26 October, 1962

and 17 to 26 April, 1963) of plant collection and vegetation study throughout the district. Large areas could be sampled and collected as the survey work was undertaken in a 'Jeep' vehicle. The route and the camping sites are indicated in the Map.

The vegetation in the narrow strip of the southern hill tracts stretching from Manpur to Naharjabua is dense, consisting of dry deciduous forests. *Tectona grandis* L. dominates throughout with *Terminalia tomentosa* W. & A., *T. bellirica* Roxb., *T. arjuna* W. & A., *Sterculia urens* Roxb., *Bombax ceiba* L. and *Butea monosperma* (Lamck.) Taub. as most noticeable associates. *Anogeissus latifolia* Wall., *Mitragyna parviflora* (Roxb.) Korth, *Albizia* sp. and *Emblica officinalis* Gaertn. constitute others frequently found throughout. Nowhere are trees lofty, with most of them ranging 15-20 m in height. The forest is more or less open, with very little stratification, and consisting mostly of tall and medium-sized trees, and large shrubs. In many places in the Manpur Forest Range it appears as if there is only a tree zone, with the shrub stratum composed of saplings of *Butea* of varying ages. However in the Choral and Naharjabua Forest Ranges there are well defined shrub strata, with *Nyctanthes arbor-tristis* L., *Vitex negundo* L., and *Helicteres isora* L. mainly composing this zone. Often, *Zizyphus* sp. and *Grewia* sp. also occur here. The forest floor is covered with gregarious growth of Asteraceae (Compositae) and Amaranthaceae herbs and low grasses with some Leguminosae and Acanthaceae herbs dispersed here and there.

There are not many climbers. A conspicuous twiner within and on the edge of forests is *Cylista scariosa* Roxb. Frequently on thickets of *Carissa congesta* Wt., *Acacia concinna* DC., and *Capparis zeylanica* L. other twiners like *Phaseolus* sp., *Mucuna* sp. and *Coccullus hirsutus* (L.) Diels, form dense canopies intertwining amongst themselves;

and with the supporting shrubs or stragglers. In the forest often twining up, and with the foliage only at the very top, and their dangling ropelike twisted stems, are climbers like *Tinospora cordifolia* Miers., *Cryptolepis buchanani* R. & S. and *Dregea volubilis* (L. f.) Benth. These can often be seen over small trees of *Anogeissus*, *Butea* or *Lagerstroemia*. Epiphytes like the Orchids, Peperomias, so conspicuous in the rain forests, are absent. Similarly, phanerogamic parasites are rare. The most common one is *Cuscuta reflexa* Roxb. forming golden-yellow stringy masses over many host plants, along fences, on avenue trees, along the edge of forest, and in disturbed areas. A rare stem parasite is the twiggy much forked *Viscum articulatum* Burm. on *Terminalia tomentosa*. The forest is much exploited and disturbed. The tribal people have a free option and repeatedly cut twigs of *Nyctanthes* for wicker work. Their cattle and goats penetrate into the forest, carry and spread weed seeds. Throughout the forest floor occur gregarious patches of plants like *Tridax procumbens* L., *Xanthium strumarium* L., *Acanthospermum hispidum* DC., *Achyranthes aspera* L., *Celosia argentea* L. and *Martynia annua* L. The herbs are not very conspicuous on the forest floor, and mostly belong to the Leguminosae, Acanthaceae, and Rubiaceae.

During October the aspect of vegetation in the plain areas and in certain cleared areas in the vicinity of hamlets located in forest areas, is very different from what had been observed during December. Much of the uncultivated open areas looked dreary and desolate, with dried grass stubs, and parched up, caky soil, and the scattered Date-palms and spiny Acacias emphasized the dryness of the area during that season. However, the October landscape was a refreshing change, the flat land bringing forth and supporting a rich, dense, lush growth of grasses. In the gentle breeze, the vast area of these grasslands, rippled and heaved; with the rhythmic swaying of the tall grasses a varying shade of green from light green to almost yellow, pervaded everywhere. Throughout the area amidst which Indore part of the Bombay-Agra Highway runs, these grasslands abounded and stretched for miles. Also all along the way there was a regular procession of ox carts loaded with hay, evidently the rich harvest from the neighbouring grasslands.

The grasslands also occur amidst the dry deciduous, teak dominated forest, significantly in the vicinity of hamlets and in the region of regular camping sites of the nomadic tribals. These areas are mostly in the lower reaches of the hilly zones, constituting the southern part of Indore district. The grassland here is still not homogeneous. A sprinkling of stunted trees of *Butea monosperma*, young saplings of *Terminalia* sp. and *Acacia* sp., can all be noticed and these become denser at the margin

and gradually merge into the forest. However, in the further northern region of the district which constitutes a flat, plain area the grasslands tend to be more or less pure, with practically no woody plants amidst. All the same, careful observation would indicate areas where woody vegetation did exist and occasional doggedly persisting old trees of *Phoenix*, *Acacia*, *Butea* and *Terminalia* can be spotted. These observations would undoubtedly lead to the conclusion, that like in many other areas of the country the grasslands are man made, and have come into being consequent on the gradual opening of the forest by clearing for fuel and timber. The grasses have taken over the land thus opened, have found the environment and the soil congenial, and have become well established.

The species composition of the grasslands, whether in the clearings of the deciduous forests, or in the open plain flat areas, is practically the same. In certain wet or marshy patches, in the neighbourhood of temporary rainwater ponds or seasonal streams, there are large stands of the very tall grass *Coix lacryma-jobi* L. and of *Saccharum spontaneum* L. conspicuous due to its white feathery spikes. The generally dominant species are *Themeda quadrivalvis* (L.) Ktze., *Heteropogon contortus* (L.) P. Beauv., *Apluda mutica* L., *Chrysopogon fulvus* (Spr.) Chiov. and *Pseudanthistiria hispida* Hk. f. Not so conspicuous, but evident enough, is *Cymbopogon martinii* (Roxb.) Wats. These are all tall grasses, growing to a height of about 2 m. Amidst the grasses also occur several leguminous plants, equally good for fodder. These are several species of *Alysicarpus*, *Indigofera* and *Crotalaria*.

All the grasses are harvested by the close of October and stored as hay for feeding cattle through the rest of the year. Considering that much of the area is flat, and the glasslands are all practically simultaneously harvested, leaving the soil exposed to the intense Sun of the summer months, and the breeze, would undoubtedly contribute to soil erosion, even though not evident now. This needs a little careful attention and a method whereby the soil binding effect of the grasses can be retained, even when they are harvested, has to be worked out.

Much of the rest of the district is cultivated. Cotton, wheat, sorghum, and Cajan-pea are the main crops, and in some places sugarcane, tobacco, Linum, and coriander. Semi-wild trees like *Tamarindus indica* L., *Madhuca longifolia* (Koenig) Macb. and *Azadirachta indica* Juss. and fruit trees like *Mangifera indica* L. occur in clumps or groves here and there, and indicate village or hamlet sites. Within the hamlets and near temples and such like buildings obviously grown with great care, are trees of *Aegle marmelos* Corr., *Michelia*

champaca L., and *Bauhinia variegata* L. The interspersed uncultivated land supports a scattered scrub vegetation. The most prominent is the wild date-palm *Phoenix sylvestris* L. In between these gaunt palms occur the spiny *Acacia* trees with their crooked, twiggy branches and spreading crown. Species of *Zizyphus*, mostly *Zizyphus nummularia* L. also contribute to the scene, with the well-armed Compositae herb *Echinops echinatus* Roxb. Even these which are at the mercy of local populations of goats remain stunted.

The many streams overflow during the rains and dry up during the summer months. On the banks of these water-courses and in the waterholes and ponds formed temporarily, occur herbs commonly associated with such localities. *Polygonum glabrum* Willd., and *Hygrophila auriculata* (Schumach) Heine form dense gregarious growths, with *Caesulia axillaris* Roxb. and *Coix lacryma-jobi* L. forming small patches here and there. *Alternanthera sessilis* (L.) R. Br., *Portulaca oleracea* L., *Amaranthus polygamus* L. are common on the moist sandy banks. *Limnophyton obtusifolium* Miq., *Vallisneria spiralis* L. are rooted in water with *Ipomoea aquatica* Forsk. stretching on the water surface with rosettes of *Trapa natans* L. var. *bispinosa* Roxb. In between these forming rusty-green patches float the little water-fern *Azolla*, and at the edges *Marselia quadrifolia* L. another water-fern. Often at the margin of the ponds can be noticed round patches of a liver-wort, *Ricciocarpus natans* (L.) Cord., and several green algae *Chara* sp., *Spirogyra* sp., *Zygnema* sp., *Oedogonium* sp. and *Voucheria*.

The land-ferns and the fern-allies which form very attractive constituents of rain forests are practically absent. *Actiniopteris australis* Link, with its small fan like fronds occurs in crags of granite, as also the silver fern *Cheilanthes farinosa* (Forsk.) Klf. At Choral and in the gorge at Patalpani, in moist crevices, in cool shade, clumps of *Adiantum caudatum* L. and *A. philippense* L. may be found. *Equisetum* sp. and *Selaginella* sp. also are present, but quite rare.

An analysis of the data indicates the following 8 families as dominant, in the order of abundance: Leguminosae (*sensu lato*) (48 G., 56 sp.); Poaceae (Gramineae) (40 G., 56 sp.); Asteraceae (Compositae) (27 G., 32 sp.); Euphorbiaceae (11 G., 22 sp.); Acanthaceae (15 G., 21 sp.); Rubiaceae (12 G., 15 sp.); and Malvaceae (8 G., 12 sp.). The enumeration that follows includes 566 species, 373 genera and 94 families of flowering plants. The collections on which the list is based are deposited in the herbarium of the Botanical Survey of India, Western Circle, Poona. Further, the list includes plants mentioned by Biscoe also. Wherever it has been possible to verify his data in the field, but no herbarium specimen could be made due to the plant

being in a vegetative state only, our verification is indicated by an!. Whenever there is no collection number or an exclamation mark, the plant is included only on the authority of Biscoe and needs verification. The annotation includes, after the botanical name, local name as used in the Indore area (taken after Biscoe and verified), habitat, frequency, and locality, with the collector and his number. The reference to Biscoe's work is indicated by B with the numeral immediately following denoting the page number. Nomenclature has been revised to conform to modern taxonomic usage and in accordance with the current Montreal Code.
