species for Madhya Pradesh viz. Stylidium kunthii Wall. ex DC. and Chirita bifolia D. The specimens are deposited in the herbarium of Central Circle, Botanical Survey of India, Allahabad (BSA).




Fig. 1. Stylidium kunthii Wall. ex DG. A. A branch. B. Flowering branch. C. Flowers. D. A flower showing ovary, column of the stamens and stigma.

Stylidium kunthii Wall. ex DC. (Fig. 1) represented by Panigrahi 8689 and rooting in the sandy alluvial soil and in flowering condition was collected by G. Panigrahi from Pali in Bilaspur district of Madhya Pradesh on 17-4-65.




Fig. 2. Chirita bifolia D. Don A. Entire plant (Vegetative). B. Plant in flower.

Chirita bifolia D. Don (Fig. 2) according to Clarke (1884), is a temperate species occurring at 1830 m (6000 ft) from Garhwal to Nepal in the Western Himalayas. Chirita bifolia D. Don represented by Panigrahi 4509 was collected by G. Panigrahi from Dhupgarh (1230 m) on the Pachmari Plateau on 26-7-64. However, the species not only

at a height of about 1230 m, when considered against its earlier record from the temperate Himalayas, is of phytogeographical interest.
