NOTES ON THE DISTRIBUTION OF BAUHINIA KHASIANA BAKER (LEGUMINOSAE : CAESALPINIOIDEAE)

Larsen et al. (1980) while providing a taxonomic account on the Bauhinias from Cambodia, Laos and Vietnam mentioned that Bauhinia khasiana Baker ssp. khasiana is distributed in N. E. India, Laos, Vietnam and Hainan. At the same time, the absence of the subspecies from the intermediate regions i.e. between the extremities of the reported occurrence was apprehended due to insufficient collection. As regards its distribution in the Indian region Larsen et al. (l.c.) took into account the type locality i.e. Khasia hills in Meghalaya but overlooked the record from Tirap Frontier Division in Arunachal Pradesh (Panigrahi, 1967), a place situated very close to Burma.

On the contrary, in some subsequent Indian regional floras (Balakrishnan, 1981; Haridasan and Rao, 1985) the taxon was stated to be an endemic one being restricted only to Meghalaya but it is evident that Balakrishnan (l.c.); Haridasan and Rao (l.c.) also overlooked its record from the aforesaid localities.

In course of a recent taxonomic study on the Indian Bauhinias a collection of B. khasiana ssp. khasiana has also been observed from Nagaland in addition to those from Meghalaya and Arunachal Pradesh and thus the former view finds some support as the Larsen, K., S. S. Larsen and J. E. Vidal. Légumidistribution gap is reduced to a certain extent.
