Perennial herbs. Culms stout, upto 1 m tall. Leaves 30-45 cm long, lanceolate acuminate. Sheaths loose. Ligule a ridge of hairs. Panicle elongate, erect; branches 2-3 cm long, spiciform. Spikelets 3-4 seriate, ovoid, secund, densely imbricate, stoutly pedicelled; rhachis angled and scabrid. Glume I \pm 2.5 mm long, ovate-acute, scabrid on the nerves; glume II \pm 3 mm long, broadly lanceolate, hairy on the nerves. Lower lemma male, oblong obtuse. Palea narrowly oblong, hyaline. Upper lemma hermaphrodite, \pm 2 mm long, scabrid, oyate, shortawned. Callus very shortly bearded. Stamens 3.

A perennial herb in the hilly-tract.

Perennial climber in the hilly-tract.

Found in humid, shady places in the hilly-tract.

A twining perennial in the hilly-tract.

Argyreia thomsonii (Clarke) Craib.

A slender twiner.

Fl. : August-October.

A submerged herb.
