But the truth is that all these things cannot bring health, sleep, peace of mind and happiness.

This writer has a noting taken from the speech of Dr.Sarvapalli Radhakrishnan, then Vice-President of India, 50 years back. "Also another noting from Swami Ranganathananda's speech at Bangalore 20 years back inaugurating the installation of an advanced heart operation equipment at a leading Nursing Home in the city.
